

A New Bus Service

Villages in our parish now benefit from two regular bus services that are open to all members of the public:

- The 918 (blue double decker), which runs between Severn Beach and Thornbury (Rock Street and The Castle School) at the start and end of the school day, on weekdays.
- The Y2C (minibus), a pilot service which runs between Yate and Cribbs Causeway 11 times per day, from Monday to Saturday.

Both services need the support of local people to make sure they continue to operate, so please make sure you use them. You can pay on board for both services, they should accept cash or card.

What's the difference?

As well as stopping at Rock Street in Thornbury, the 918 delivers and collects students within the school grounds at The Castle School (especially useful in bad weather or if carrying lots of stuff). It is a larger bus, with the capacity to carry all the students. The service isn't just for school children though: it can be used by anyone. At the other end of its journey, the 918 serves Easter Compton, Pilning and Severn Beach (not Cribbs Causeway). It is operated by Eurocoaches.



The Y2C is a new, pilot, minibus service which started on 1st September this year. It runs between Yate and Cribbs Causeway (not Severn Beach) and also runs on Saturdays (same timetable as weekdays). It

uses Westlink minibuses, but is a scheduled service, and doesn't need to be booked via the app or phone. The timing of the Y2C service has been arranged to complement the 918 rather than compete with it. In particular, the 16.31 service from Thornbury could be useful for students doing after school activities.

Why should we support the buses?

Since the loss of our former regular 622 bus service in April 2023, many people have campaigned for the return of a regular service to connect our villages, particularly to help people who have no other transport. The 918 has been operating since 2023, because parents have conducted an ongoing. successful campaign so that children can reach The Castle School by public transport. Working with South Gloucestershire Council, the campaign recently secured funding until July 2026, and it will continue to seek funding for future vears. For more information contact: cbrewser@freeuk.com.

Now, efforts by the Council mean the new pilot Y2C scheme is in place, with scheduled buses running throughout the day. However, the pilot must be supported if this service is to continue in the long term.

Here's what's in store for 2025 -2026. Everyone welcome... just turn up!

Wed, 1st Oct. 2025: Welcome, all! After a short AGM, Matthew Riddle will tell us how the Lower Severn Internal Drainage Board works to ensure we don't have water, water everywhere, He'll trace the Board's roots back centuries, as well as covering its current work.

Wed. 5th November 2025: Jane Duffus has compiled three books called 'The Women who Built Bristol'. Each book contains lively profiles of 250 ordinary and extraordinary women who have lived in or had links to Bristol. Jane will tell us about some of the women featured.

Wed. 3rd December 2025: We welcome back retired professor and local writer Gareth Williams, whose latest 5 star-rated book tells the true story of the top-secret British atomic programme, codenamed "Tube Alloys," established in 1940. He explains how, without the expertise of this programme's scientists, Robert Oppenheimer's research at Los Alamos would not have succeeded.

Wed. 7th January 2026: GKN is a successful local aerospace company with its roots going back to the Dowlais Iron Works near Merthyr Tydfil, founded in 1759. Dr Victoria Owens will tell us about Lady Charlotte Guest who, for three years, on the death of her husband, headed up this company. Under her management, Dowlais became the world's largest manufacturing company.

Wed. 4th February 2026: Dr Toby Jones is a nautical archaeologist and the Curator of the Newport Medieval Ship, a vessel found in the River Usk in Newport in 2002. He will tell us about the ship's discovery, how and where it was built, its current situation and future plans.

Wed. 4th March 2026: Dr Robert W. Jones will tell us about the life of William Marshall, Earl of Pembroke, one of the most powerful Anglo-Norman lords in medieval England. He led a colourful military life and, as a statesman, served five English kings. He substantially extended and modernised Chepstow Castle, based on his experience of warfare in France and the Crusades.



We walk and drive past rhines (pronounced reens) every day. There's a network of them all around our area. Why are they there? Who made them? Who keeps them going?

We're opening the 2025/26 Olveston Parish Historical Society season on 1st October with a talk about the organisation which historically has kept us and local farmland from getting flooded, but also ensures water is where it should be when it's needed.



Matthew Riddle, vice-chair of our local Internal Drainage Board, which covers the whole of the Lower Severn, will explain the work of the Board, perhaps best described as 'a quiet, unseen service, that's valued by the people who know what they do'.

The LSIDB can trace its roots back to its predecessor, The Court of Sewers, in Tudor times. So, Matthew will incorporate some of its history into the talk, as well as describing the Lower

Severn Internal Drainage Board's current work. This now includes management of habitats for wildlife.

Before Matthew's talk, there will be a brief AGM.



A bit of Planning on the Allotment goes a Long Way. With luck!

The staples on my plot are beans, chard, kale and asparagus. This year has been very difficult for the obvious reasons – it's been hot and dry. I think the swifts liked it, their magnificent flying displays just before sunset are a summer highlight and raise the spirits while watering and watering, followed the next day by watering and watering.

When planning for beans it's best to prepare a bean trench in the early spring. Put a lot of compost in there and water it well before replacing the soil. It's hard to go wrong with runner beans and with a little effort, even this year I had a halfway decent crop, and the freezer has been topped up to a reasonable extent.



The climbing French beans (Climbing Blue Lake, a great texture and flavour) did better, but their season is shorter than that of the runners. I always plant a mix of the two to cope with the unknown future our weather always provides and I'm so glad that I did.



To get the best from beans is straightforward. Weed the bed, prepare a trench 3 or 4 weeks before planting, weed again a week or two later, and, in an ideal world get the canes up before planting. We can count on strong winds from time to time as the allotment site is open to the south-west, so I try to orient my line of canes roughly south-west to north-east. Beans don't need watering. in a normal season, until the pods are developing. Planting the seed beans in a straight line is a great help with the hoeing once they show up and the action of the hoe also keeps the soil surface open and absorbent.

I also put a sweet pea or two on my canes. This is to attract the pollinators with a guarantee of a feed on the bright flowers and so aid the setting of the bean flowers as they buzz around the plants. I also over-plant, putting in more seeds than I need and then ruthlessly taking out the weakest as they sprout.


So, what happened this year? Well, the first blasts of wind came from the north-west and early in the season, before the beans were up and binding my rough and ready tying of the canes, so a bit of re-tying was needed. And then it was hot and dry. The plots began to suffer except where diligent plot-holders were getting round with the watering can. My plot was no exception, and far more water was needed than I had expected. But it has been worth it, and I was still getting a crop into September.



What about planning for next year? I'm going to get better trenches dug, and I'll act on those reminders from the gardening experts about mulching and getting lots of organic material into the soil. A good organic mulch, perhaps compost, spent growbag


medium or manure is great for soil protection and for soil improvement but only if it's on a moist soil, so I'm waiting for the rains to come and really soak the soil before I spread the contents of my compost bins.

As for my other staples - the kale and chard (above) did ok, but my asparagus really couldn't cope with the weather. That's my excuse and I'm sticking to it.

On 6th August 1926 Trudy Erdele, an American competition swimmer, Olympic champion, and world record holder, became the first woman to swim across the English Channel. Facing unbelievable odds - think poisonous jelly fish for a start - in an era when women were very much second-class citizens, the obstacles this young girl had to overcome were immense. Daisy Ridley takes the title role in this film from 2024 and portrays the challenges faced by women in the early 20th century. A childhood ridden with poor health gave way to international fame when Trudy finally achieved her lifelong ambition. In some ways this is a feminist film, but there are lessons for everyone in a powerful film of achievement against all the odds and challenges that society at that time threw at young, ambitious women.





Update on The Armstrong

After the delightful Open Day on June 29th the builders moved in and the transformation of the fover and bar area began. Project leader Chris Roberts gave an update in August: "The renovation works which began at the beginning of July are progressing well. The old fover and bar area have been stripped out and the ceiling removed from the Cossham Hall, ready to be replaced by a more energy efficient solution, while retaining the vaulted panelling to maintain the acoustic benefits. The works will continue through the rest of the year with the expectation that they will be finished by December".

An unexpected highlight in August was a visit to the site by Maggie Lansdown. the generous benefactor who has made Phase One of the renovation possible. She visited the Armstrong to see the progress and to meet some of the people involved in the project. Maggie's local connections and her Mum's friendship with Jill Dimond's mum were catalysts for her involvement, so it was especially good to meet her in person. It was an opportunity for some of the team to thank her and she was pleased to put faces to names and hear about the future plans.

Meanwhile, as the builders transform and renovate, there is a hive of activity in the teams planning for the re-opening and management of the Cossham Hall and the bar and fover. One group has been visiting other venues in the region to research prices, programmes, management and the role of volunteers in the new organisation – many will be needed! While it has been very encouraging to learn from these successful venues such as The Subscription Rooms at Stroud, the Memorial Theatre at Frome and The Goods Shed at Tetbury, it has also become clear that The Armstrong compares well in terms of space and flexibility, so the outlook is positive. There will be many opportunities for community involvement and active support one of which will be the help required to clear, redesign and plant the outside space once the builders have cleared the site.

Fundraising for Phase Two, the renovation of the Armstrong Hall itself, is paramount for the completion of the scheme so that is also a vital and intensive activity in these months prior to completion of Phase One.

Oceans

...... are the beating heart of our planet, shaping our weather, storing carbon, and nurturing incredible forms of life, from the tiniest plankton to the mightiest whale. Covering around 71% of earth's surface, earth's 5 oceans hold nearly 97% of all water on earth. They

produce over half of global oxygen and absorb half of all man-made climate-warming carbon dioxide, and an astonishing 90% of the excess heat generated by climate change. The CO2 that is absorbed makes the water more acidic which leads to the damage of wildlife. Extra heat absorption is making sea levels rise. So far, the ocean bed is the least explored or understood. If exploration goes unregulated the ocean ecosystem will be severely disturbed.

The Pacific Ocean is the largest and deepest of the oceans and is home to the Mariana Trench which is the deepest point on our planet. The Atlantic Ocean is home to the Gulf Stream which acts as a global thermometer regulating weather patterns. It is the key to trade and travel between several continents.

At the UN Conference held recently in July it was agreed by 170 nations to instigate urgent action on conservation and sustainability of the world's oceans by expanding the marine protection area off Polynesia to 5 million sq. km. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres also referred to deep sea mining saying that it cannot become the new mining area. As of July 2024, only exploratory licenses have been issued with no commercial-scale deep sea mining operations yet. The International Seabed Authority (ISA) regulates all mineral-related activities in international waters and has granted 31 exploration licenses so far. This is a worrying factor in the protection of the planet's oceans
